VISIT WARWICK CASTLE

From the moment you walk through the gates of Warwick Castle, you can see that this is no ordinary place.

It is famous for the fun and excitement you can have, and also for its history. In 1068, William the Conqueror first built a fort here made of earth and wood, which was later replaced by a stone construction.

Britain’s greatest medieval fortress is set in a huge area of beautiful parkland. Events take place throughout the year at this fairytale castle. Visit the Great Hall, the Dungeon, the Towers, where Warwick’s ghosts return to haunt the living. Warwick Ghosts-Alive (open from 19th March – 31st October) is a spooky, live action experience that brings the true story of Warwick’s most famous ghost to life. It tells the tale of Sir Fulke Greville’s tragic murder of 400 years ago, using a terrifying mix of live actors and sound and visual effects. It is screamingly good fun, but its scary content may make it unsuitable for children under eight or anyone that becomes nervous easily. Tickets for the event can be bought at the Ghost Tower.

Attractions at the Castle also include Themed Evenings. The Kingmaker’s Feast is a night of wonderful food and takes you back to the Middle Ages. The Highwayman’s Supper is an evening of 18th century music, gossip and drama. For further details, contact the Sales Office.

A NEW SOUND IN BRIT METAL

Thrash Metal, Power Metal, Death Metal, Black Metal, Hair Metal, even Viking Metal. Wouldn't another type of Metal be just too much? Well, there's a new Metal band on the British scene with a new Metal sound – Suck.

They play loud. You expect high volume from a Metal band. They play fast, sometimes Thrash Metal fast. They have complex chord progressions in the tradition of Hammerfall. They have elements of Punk, as in Nu-Metal, but they also bring in Asian sounds of their ethnic community.

Suck has come out of the immigrant Asian community in Bradford. You would expect racism to be a theme in their songs. "Sure, we're Asians, and Muslim," says Kareem Arshad, lead singer and songwriter of the group. "People look at us as if we're terrorists. But that's how people look at all teenagers today, whatever their colour."

Metal lyrics are often about drugs and violence. "Young people are angry. They feel genuinely

hurt. But violence isn't our scene. And we're not into drugs," says Kareem. "We sing about what it's like being a teenager in Britain. They're adults who are treated like children. They have beliefs but no power. It's a frustrating time. You want it all, but you can't get it. That's what we sing about."

Suck first hit the scene at the Brighton Metal Festival. Before that, they were playing in clubs in the north of England. Now they play to large audiences in stadiums. "But it all started," says Kareem, "when our teacher asked us to play at the school concert. The kids liked us, and we went on from there."

So what's next for Suck? "The plan is to record a CD in June and then go on a tour of clubs in Europe," says Kareem. "We still need a couple more songs for the CD, and then we go into the recording studio."

Purists might say Suck's type of Metal isn't "true" Metal. But Suck's specific sound and the direct way their lyrics speak to teenagers has brought new life to Britain's Metal scene.
